PARISH INFORMATION

Weddings: Couples need to make arrangements at least six months prior to the wedding date. No date may be reserved until after a discussion with the priest of the parish.

Funerals: Arrangements must be confirmed with the rectory office by the funeral director before any publication in the newspaper.

Baptisms: On the second Sunday of the month, following the 10:00AM Mass. Arrangements should begin to be made about three months before the birth of the child.


PANCAKE BREAKFAST

PSR PROGRAM 2024 – 2025

A reminder that the PSR Program's first class will be Monday September 9th. You must be registered before the first class.

Our PSR program is held at St. Mark parish on Monday evenings from 6:30-7:30 in the school building. We serve students in Grades 1-8. Students in grades 2 and 8 are prepared to receive the Sacraments of Reconciliation and First Eucharist (grade 2) and Confirmation (Grade 8), as part of our curriculum. For a student to receive these Sacraments they MUST be enrolled and attend PSR the previous year. To register for the 2024-2025 school year:

Friends,

The papal intention this past month was "for political leaders, that they be at the service of their own people, working for integral human development and for the common good, especially caring for the poor and those who have lost their jobs."

Certainly, nothing can possibly go wrong for me by commenting on this intention, right?

Like most of you, I of course have strong opinions on politics from trying to keep informed about the world. I only openly talk about them, however, with close personal friends. It's actually very hard some weekends to preach and to connect the gospel to our current lives without crossing that line. But beyond the fact that I can't talk about politicians or political parties and instead can only talk about political issues... which are hard to separate from politicians and political parties... there's also the fact that preaching homilies to you or writing in the bulletin is not a dialog. There is no chance for me to listen to your perspective or even just how you hear and understand what I am trying to say. I would much rather talk to you about the things of faith, and trust you to apply them to the politics of the day on your own.

I will say something, though, about this intention. I don't care whether we are talking about past, present, or future, what politician or political party we are talking about, what matter is being discussed, or what country and system of government we live in... absolutely in every situation, yes... politicians should be at the service of their people and work for the common good. It has been good to pray for that to be true in every country and for every Catholic.




